### FLYING - CONFESSIONS OF A FREE WOMAN

Jennifer Fox - Zohe Films

Jennifer Fox's *Flying – Confessions of A Free Woman* is a six-hour documentary in the eyes (and camera lens) of Fox, a single female and Jewish filmmaker from New York. The subtext of the project is the statement; what it means to be a free woman today. Fox's dramatic documentary explores relationships as they unfold during a four-year course. Jennifer travels to 17 countries to understand how diverse women define their lives.

She uses a "passing the camera" technique to demonstrate perspective, race, class and nationality. Similar ideals among the women tie a bond. *Flying – Confessions of A Free Woman* is a personal journey – a docu-experiment, feminist theory, art and politics, yet most notably, confessions of a free woman. ☆ ☆ ☆ ☆
